Program Management

Aircraft Sustainment

As F-35 Sustainment VP, increased Mission Capable Rate from 54% to more than 70% while reducing industry-controlled flying hour costs by 44% and setting the program on a course to additional reductions via a multiple year Performance Based Logistics contract.

Strategic Planning/ Budgeting

In Director, Global Reach Programs role, developed SAF/AQ's first 20-year planning horizon tool to assess Total Ownership Costs by mission area. Produced Business Case Analyses using investment and sustainment costs to inform strategic tradeoffs during budget build.

Congressional Engagement

As F-22 VP, secured Service and congressional committee support for a long-term modernization plan that fielded near term capabilities and developed future capabilities enabling the F-22 to adapt to emerging threats and maintain US Air Dominance out to the 2040 timeframe. Worked with the Air Force to ensure budget was in place.

Teambuilding

Revitalized 400-person Contractor Logistics Support organization at Tinker AFB responsible for 433 aircraft in 33 design series including Air Force One, E-4, KC-10 and DV airlift resources. Restored morale and esprit de corps in largely civilian workforce.

Foreign Military Sales

Led a 13-member nation consortium responsible for NATO AWACS to agree on a plan to modernize NATO, French and UK aircraft via a common Block 40/45 configuration. Developed plan that compressed fielding of modification for 31-jet fleet by four years.

Built a foundation for F-35 cooperative support; ensured all partner nations and FMS customers received consistent sustainment support. Enabled global responsiveness from the entire F-35 enterprise across 21 bases and 8 ships operating globally.
